

### Congratulations to the Asia Cohort!

- Thanks to the leadership of the Philippines team, particularly Dr. Vena Pearl Bongolan and John Paul Petrola who have pioneered the Asia cohort's knowledge production by debuting the 1<sup>st</sup> Episode of their Colloquium series on AI & health. The first episode of the series featured the Indigenous People of Philippines, also known as the Ati People. The Community Engagement session brought afore multiple barriers that hindered the Ati people from accessing quality services, including health, as well as different strategies of resistance that amplified the need for sustainable partnerships with vulnerable communities.
- There are plans to archive the colloquium series & convert them into book chapters & broadly strengthen the series as a sustainable knowledge production outlet for the cohort.



## Fostering a collaborative partnership with AeHIN

 Prof. Kong has reportedly reached out to Dr. Alvin Marcello of AeHIN seeking to partner with their organization to collaboratively strengthen quality health outcomes in the region. It was





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discussed that a consensus had been reached for the two entities for explore possible synergies. Partnership with AeHN was exciting for the network because there was a lot of commonalities in the organizational visions, and aspirations. Additionally, the two organizations shared a common evolutional trajectory as they were both beneficiaries of the IDRC's generous seed funding.

### **Philippines**

- The team reportedly had their launch locked for the 27-28<sup>th</sup> November and the 1<sup>st</sup> December in order to align with the commemoration of the Indigenous People's Mental Health Week. A few prominent guests had been invited. The National Center for Mental Health was on board and happily sponsoring the event.
- Prof. de Castro reported that he had been invited to join a round table discussion on Vaccine Equity & the Establishment of mRNA Vaccine Hubs in Vietnam and Indonesia; People's Vaccine Alliance -Asia {Coalition for People Rights to Health-CPRH}-(Convened by the World Health Organization).
- Prof. Riveria spoke at the National Gender and Development Conference (NEDA), where she gave a talk about "Understanding Gender, Feminism & Intersectionality."
- Dr. de Castro also mentioned that they had Manuscript on Lessons in the Implementation of the Atipan Project (Telehealth) for Universal Health Care (UHC), and it was under review.
