Team Lebanon has been hard at work for the past fortnight. They were reportedly done with their literature review and were reviewing their first article: "Review of Pathogens Considered to be Associated with High Pandemic Risk Presently and in the Near Future." After a thorough internal review process, the article will be submitted as a manuscript.

Morocco

The team reported that they had finished a couple research papers, which were undergoing a review process:

- i) "Survey on AI for TB Propagation Modeling."
- ii) "AI 4 Aided Detection for TB Diagnosis: A Survey."
- iii) "Meta-survey on AI for Tuberculosis Mycobacterium Detection, Propagation and Modeling and Resistance Prediction."
- Leaders have been assigned to the different papers, and the data collection process was underway.

Palestine

Team Palestine was also hard at work, forging partnerships with relevant stakeholders and government ministries. The following two papers were in the pipeline, and currently being reviewed.
