Collaboration with WHO -Africa Region

- Prof. Kong introduced Kevin Ousman from the WHO-Africa Region to the Africa cohort. Ousman had an opportunity to present to the Africa cohort about the prospects of a partnership. He saw the partnership as a strategic move that seeks to leverage Artificial Intelligence for purposes of strengthening health systems in Africa.
- Ousman strongly recommended a physical strategic planning meeting to come up with a concrete plan that will guide the partnership going forward.

Senegal

- Congratulations to Team Senegal on their continued leadership. On the 10th November, 2023 Prof. FAYE led the AI & Ethics Readiness Assessment report for Senegal, which was presented at the UNESCO General Conference in Paris (UNESCO Headquarters).
- Meanwhile, AI4DECLIC Team member Prof Mouhamadou Lamine BA was featured at a high level panel at the Africa Universities' Day 2023 Commemoration whose focus was "Artificial Intelligence in Higher Education."









Ethiopia

- Team Ethiopia has been actively working on their data collection plan; this entailed meeting with their collaborative partner CORE Group-Ethiopia to try and understand the nature of the data they had in their possession, as well as to discuss the functionalities required to establish the project's AI system.
- The team also visited several health centers within the Jimma zone where they managed to promote the project and explored possible collaborations.
- The team also reported that the technical team continued to have its strategic planning and debriefing meeting to re-evaluate the project successes and discuss emerging priorities.
